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

- 21 | EmCare, but I don't recall that specific --
- 22 Q. Okay. And you had an email account through EmCare.
- 23 | Correct?
- 24 A. I did.
- 25 | Q. And your name was listed as jimanesthesiologymckinney on

- 1 | that account. Correct?
- 2 A. It doesn't sound right.
- 3 Q. That doesn't sound right to you?
- 4 A. But it may be.
- 5 Q. Okay. But the account -- The email account that you did
- 6 | have through EmCare you used to exchange emails with employees
- 7 of EmCare. Correct?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. Okay. And you are telling me that you don't recall
- 10 exchanging an email with David Copple that had an image of a
- 11 penis with a tattoo on it?
- 12 A. No, I do not.
- 13 Q. Okay. Do you recall receiving an email from Mr. Copple
- 14 | with anything penis related?
- 15 A. No.
- 16 | Q. Do you recall sending an email to Mr. Copple in response
- 17 | to an email he sent to you with an image titled tat.jpg and
- 18 | your response being deep or shallow?
- 19 | A. No.
- 20 Q. Okay.
- 21 MS. HALLMON: Your Honor, Intervening Plaintiff
- 22 | would offer exhibit -- This is not an exhibit for impeachment,
- 23 | but it is Stokes 30. May I approach?
- 24 THE COURT: Yes.

It was something that was embedded in the 21 22 email. It wasn't -- you can tell from the top line that there 23 is not an attachment. It is actually embedded into the email. 24 MS. MARTIN: And Your Honor, that is exactly why it is prejudicial to us. They didn't produce the image to us, 25

- 3 Do you see here this is an email to you from David Copple
- 4 | with an embedded JPEG is I think how that is referred to that
- 5 says tat.jpg?
- 6 A. Yes.
- 7 Q. Do you see that?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. It is April 2nd, 2009. Correct?
- 10 A. Yes.
- 11 Q. And this is your email address at EmCare. Correct? Or
- 12 your account there at EmCare?
- 13 A. Yeah. It is a prefix. It is actually -- I know what it
- 14 | is now. It is jim.mckinney@emcare.com.
- 15 Q. Okay.
- 16 | A. And they just put a sub-heading anesthesia.
- 17 | Q. Sure. So, I mean, this is obviously not your email
- 18 | address per se. It is the way that it is titled, your name is
- 19 titled.
- 20 A. That is correct. Right.
- 21 | Q. Okay. And your response here is deep or shallow.
- 22 | Correct? Do you see that?
- 23 A. Yeah. I am looking at the time here--and again, I don't
- 24 | recall this, so remember this, but --
- 25 | Q. But this is your email address. You don't recall sending

- 1 it, but you are not suggesting somebody else typed that on
- 2 your behalf.
- 3 A. Oh, No, no, no. I am suggesting I may have been having a
- 4 different conversation with him, because he sent it at 4:00
- 5 p.m. I responded at 6:00 p.m.
- 6 Q. Okay.
- 7 A. Wait a minute here. How come the second one when I
- 8 responded at 6:00, and the third one he writes -- he is at
- 9 5:42?
- 10 Q. Could you have been traveling and perhaps been in a
- 11 different time zone?
- 12 A. I don't remember.
- 13 Q. Okay. What did you mean when you wrote deep or shallow
- 14 there?
- 15 A. See, that is what I mean. I don't know. It could be I
- 16 | was talking about an account. And then see where I say I
- 17 | chartered a plane?
- 18 Q. Uh-huh.
- 19 A. The next one up?
- 20 Q. Right.
- 21 A. So I just don't know.
- 22 | Q. You think you were using the phraseology deep or shallow
- 23 | referring to an account of EmCare?
- 24 A. Could be. I don't know.
- 25 Q. Okay.

- 1 A. But the next thing says -- he says, well, and I said I
- 2 chartered a plane.
- 3 Q. Okay. And the next one after that is an email from
- 4 Mr. Copple to you that says, "Please review. My wife." What

- 8 A. Un-huh.
- 9 Q. And your response to that was, "Nice." What did that
- 10 mean?
- 11 A. Well, let me think. Copple bought a new car for his
- 12 | wife. I remember that, because I am a car guy. I like cars.
- 13 And then up here I wrote--is this me--"Does your sweetie have
- 14 one?"
- 15 Probably says Frank."
- 16 You know who Frank is. Frank is a cohort of Copple's.
- 17 | Frank Bossio, he is a sales guy in the California area.
- 18 Q. Okay.
- 19 A. So "big boys welcome"?
- 20 | O. Don't know what that means either?
- 21 A. No. I am sorry.
- 22 | Q. Okay. Now, this is not the first time that you had a
- 23 | similar kind of exchange with Mr. Copple, was it?
- 24 A. In terms of a picture or --
- 25 | Q. Well, let me ask it this way. You and he had

- 1 | conversations in or near your office on at least one or two
- 2 occasions discussing the sizes of your penises, didn't you?
- 3 A. I don't recall those conversations.
- 4 Q. Okay. And tattoos on your penises and what they would
- 5 look like in various stages of sexual arousal. Do you recall
- 6 those conversations?
- 7 A. I do not.
- 8 Q. Okay. How about telling Mr. Copple, oh, yeah, you want
- 9 to give your wife a little piece of me, or I'll show her who
- 10 is better than you? Do you remember making a remark like that
- 11 | to Mr. Copple in your office?
- 12 A. No. I never met his wife. I don't have any idea.
- 13 Q. I see.
- 14 And he laughed back and said, oh, you can't handle her.
- 15 Remember remarks like that?
- 16 A. No.
- 17 | Q. And you have testified that Ms. Stokes had access to your
- 18 | email and had your permission to look at your email, at least
- 19 | sometimes. Correct?
- 20 A. Yeah. I don't remember how that works. There is
- 21 different levels of access. I just don't recall.
- 22 | Q. I understand. But you have previously testified that she
- 23 | did, in fact, have access to your email and had permission
- 24 | from you to look at your email, at least sometimes. Correct?
- 25 A. Yes.

- 1 Q. And this was an email -- This Exhibit No. 35 was an email
- 2 | sent through your EmCare account.
- 3 A. Yes.
- 4 Q. Correct?
- 5 A. It looks like.
- 6 Q. Okay. So these remarks that I have talked to you about
- 7 that you deny any recollection of with Mr. Copple, you are not
- 8 telling the ladies and gentlemen of the jury that you think
- 9 | that is appropriate conduct for the workplace, are you?
- 10 A. If someone was talking about that, that is inappropriate.
- 11 | Q. That is inappropriate, isn't it?
- 12 A. Yes.
- 13 Q. Okay.
- MS. HALLMON: Pass the witness.
- 15 | THE COURT: Mr. Schell or Ms. Martin?
